Get Wild about Alderney with the Wildlife Week 2024 27th May to 2nd June

Alderney Wildlife Week, the Alderney Wildlife Trust's annual event celebrating nature and full of exciting nature adventures kicks off this coming Monday.

The Alderney Wildlife Trust (AWT) is thrilled to announce the programme for Alderney Wildlife Week 2024, taking place from Monday, May 27th to Sunday, June 2nd. This year Wildlife Week is packed with activities designed to appeal to all ages and interests from guided walks to fun and informative talks and lots of family-friendly activities.

In addition to ever-popular activities like boat trips, nocturnal nature discovery walks, the Morning Moth Mayhem and Foraging Walks, this year boasts new activities such as the Wild about Woodlands' and 'Wild about Birds' walks, and a combined Pollinator Walk and Talk.

Alongside these events the AWT will be running the 'Wild About Woodlands' Forest School. Open to children from 5 to 9-years-old and led by our Team Wilder Community Support Lead. This Forest School includes six two-hour sessions, designed to foster a love of nature and learning, as well as building confidence exploring the outdoors.

For bird enthusiasts our knowledgeable Ramsar Ecologist will be the guide of the 'Wild About Birds' Walk starting at the majestic g Fort Tourgis, before winding through Bonne Terre valley and up onto the heathlands Giffoine to one of the best seabirds viewing points to see the Island's Gannets. The walk aims to help people grow their knowledge of birdlife and pick up new skills along the way.

The Pollinator Walk & Talk will be led by our Ecology Team. Focused on the beautiful town of St. Anne walkers will discover the beauty of Bloomin' Alderney while learning about the island's pollinators and finish the walk at the Island premier organic growers, Alderney Roots.

Whether you're interested in nocturnal or daylight creatures, land or marine life, Alderney Wildlife Week has something for everyone.
