Launch of the AWT Seawater Parameters Survey 2024-27.

In November 2023, the Alderney Wildlife Trust won funding from Sea-Changers, a UK based marine charity to initiate a new citizen science project, The AWT Seawater Parameters Survey. The aim of this new project is to collect long-term seawater parameter evidence across Alderney with the island's community.



The fund has enabled the AWT to purchase equipment to regularly sample seawater parameters such as sea surface temperature, pH and salinity, with citizen scientists. Our first public survey will be recording the seawater at Corblets, Arch and Saye Bays from June onwards (the date will be announced nearer the time), please contact marine@alderneywildlife.org for further joining details.

Seawater chemistry plays an important role in influencing marine habitat and species presence, abundance, distribution and health/condition. The long-term monitoring of seawater can help identify wide-scale natural trends and climate change influences (such as sea temperature increases). Limited seawater parameter information exists for Alderney and in turn, identifying issues facing its marine environment in terms of seawater chemistry is unknown. Connecting this survey with the community will provide new opportunities to promote marine life and the issues facing the marine environment. In addition, the information will be made open source to external researchers and others, to enable new engagement activities and enhance our current knowledge of our connected seas.
