Sunday 7th July A day of wildlife and horticulture with Professor Chris Baines

The Alderney Wildlife Trust (AWT) is delighted to welcome <u>Prof. Chris Baines</u> to the Island. Chris is an international renowned horticulturalist and a leading British environmental campaigner, as well as being the Vice President of the British Wildlife Trusts.

As part of a day celebrating Alderney's public green spaces the Alderney Wildlife Trust in collaboration with States of Alderney will be running a **Bioblitz on Braye Common from 2-4pm**. Braye is one of the Island's most popularly used public spaces. This year the Island's Public Works Department has pioneered an outstanding programme of public access and green space management to allow the common's wildflowers and wildlife to flourish, whilst continuing to encourage public access. The Bioblitz is being organised by the AWT's <u>State of Nature Team</u>

This event will be open to all to join the teams and Prof. Baines to explore the Common, exploring the rich wildlife and helping to record it. An event accessible to all ages you can just turn up on the day and take part, whatever the weather.

That same evening the Braye Beach Hotel will be hosting **An Evening with Prof. Baines, 7pm**. This event will see a small audience able to join Chris and his wife to hear about his life and experiences and discuss his visit, all over a 3-course dinner. Any profits from the meal will go to the charity for its work on the Alderney Waste to Food Project. This is a project run in collaboration with local grower Alderney Roots and will be launched later this month, and which Chris will be visiting to offer the benefit of his experience in horticulture, composting and soil health.
